No runners-up in war; CDS calls for 24x7 combat readiness

Future warfare to be led by fighters skilled in technological, informational, and psychological warfare: CDS

Asserting that it was time that defence forces should understand both *Shastra* (warfare) and *Shastra* (knowledge), Chief of Defence Staff General Anil Chauhan said the forces are ready for any action as the Operation Sindoor was still ongoing. Speaking at the Capstone seminar, jointly organised by the Indian Air Force (IAF) and the Centre for Air Power Studies (CAPS), Chauhan said the preparedness level of the armed forces has to be very high, 24x7, 365 days. “As I said earlier, there are no runners up in war, and giving examples of Operation Sindoor, which still continues; our preparedness level has to be very high,” he said. Stating that a warrior today needs to master all three levels of warfare - tactical, operational and



strategic in all domains, the CDS said: “We are seeing an unprecedented pace driven by a relentless march of technology. We now stand at the cusp of what I refer to as the third revolution in military affairs, a term I have coined as convergence kind of warfare. “This form of warfare

merges kinetic and non-kinetic means, combining elements of first- and second-generation warfare with the third. It is a converging tactical, operational, and strategic kind of domain,” he said. Elaborating on the third revolution, the CDS stated that it is defined by the fusion

of tactical, operational, and strategic thinking, alongside an integration of land, sea, air, cyber, space, and cognitive warfare. “Future combat will be dominated by individuals proficient not only in traditional combat roles but also in technological, informational, and psychological

warfare. Modern warriors must become masters of multi-domain operations, functioning simultaneously as tech warriors, info warriors, and scholar warriors,” he added. Speaking about the changing dynamics of the military operations globally, Chauhan said it has raised the importance of info warriors, experts trained to craft and counter narratives, fight misinformation, and influence public perception in the invisible battlefield of cognition. “A scholar warrior is a military professional who combines intellectual depth. It combines skills. This individual possesses both strong academic knowledge and practical military expertise, enabling them to analyse complex situations, standardize effectively and adapt to diverse challenges in a dynamic security environment,” Chauhan said.

Ajmer teacher loses ₹12.80 lakh in cyber fraud, accused arrested

JAIPUR, 25 JULY

A woman teacher was duped out of Rs 12.80 lakh by cyber-criminals in Rajasthan's Ajmer district. The Ajmer Police have arrested one accused in connection with the case from Jaipur. The victim, Gargi Das, an English teacher at the prestigious Mayo College Girls School, received a phone call on 25 August, 2024, from a person claiming to be a Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) officer.

The caller threatened to disconnect her mobile number. Shortly afterwards, she received a WhatsApp video call from another individual posing as an officer of the Mumbai Crime Branch.

He falsely claimed that an FIR for money laundering had been filed against her in Canada. The fraudsters intimidated her by sharing forged legal documents and instructed her to maintain silence.

Under pressure and fear of arrest, the cybercriminals coerced her into transferring Rs 12.80 lakh in four separate transactions.

Ajmer Circle Officer Hanuman Singh informed that an FIR was registered on 26 September, 2024.

During the probe, it was found that a portion of the defrauded money was transferred to a bank account belonging to Junja Ram alias Jeetu (23), a resident of Barmer.

The accused had rented out his account to cyber thugs for Rs 10,000, unaware of the scale of the crime.

Police said around Rs 1 lakh of the cheated amount was transferred to this account and later withdrawn via cheque. AGENCIES

Kargil Vijay Diwas Padyatra to be held in Drass today

‘MY Bharat’ (*Mera Yuva Bharat*), under the aegis of the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, will organise *Kargil Vijay Diwas Padyatra* on 26 July in Drass, Kargil to mark the 26th anniversary of India's victory in the 1999 Kargil War.

Led by Union Minister of Youth Affairs & Sports and Labour & Employment Mansukh Mandaviya, the padyatra will also witness the participation of Union Minister of State for Defence Sanjay Seth, alongside over 1,000 youth, veterans, armed forces personnel, families of martyrs, and civil society members.

The *padyatra*, covering a distance of 1.5 kilometres, will commence at 7:00 a.m. from the grounds of Himabass Public High School, Drass, and will conclude at the grounds of Government



Higher Secondary School, Bhimbet.

Subsequent to the Padyatra, Union Ministers, accompanied by 100 youth volunteers, will proceed to the Kargil War Memorial to lay wreaths and offer homage to the soldiers who made the supreme sacrifice during the 1999 Kargil conflict.

On this occasion, the minister will also facilitate 26 women bikers of the Shakti Udgosh Foundation, who will arrive at the War Memorial after completing a long-dis-

tance motorbike rally undertaken as a tribute to the martyrs.

The *padyatra* will also feature a plantation drive under the ‘*Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam*’ campaign, underscoring the alignment of patriotic duty with environmental consciousness and a commitment towards sustainable development in a Viksit Bharat @2047.

In the days leading up to the padyatra, MY Bharat has been actively engaging youth and local communities in the region through activities including essay writing, painting, elocution competitions, and *Yuva Samvads* (youth dialogues). These pre-event activities aim to cultivate civic awareness, celebrate stories of valour, and strengthen emotional connect with the armed forces.

Through these platforms, the *Amrit Peedhi* and nation-builders of tomorrow are

being sensitised to the ideals of service, sacrifice and patriotism.

This *padyatra* is part of the wider Viksit Bharat Padyatras initiative, which aims to foster national pride, deepen civic engagement, and strengthen the spirit of unity among the youth through commemorative and participatory programmes across the country.

Bihar CM lashes out at Opposition legislators for ‘irrational behaviour’

Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar lashed out at opposition legislators for their ‘irrational behaviour’ throughout the Monsoon Session of the Bihar Assembly that concluded on Friday without any meaningful discussion.

He also criticised the opposition MLAs and MLCs for coming to the House wearing black clothes. Expressing his disappointment, the chief minister said that the opposition had never previously come together wearing black attire.

Headed: “They have been wearing black clothes continuously throughout this session. This has never happened before. Earlier, there used to

be disruption for just a day or two.” Amid sloganeering of opposition members, the Chief Minister said: “From the Assembly to the Council, they are behaving irrationally. When they should be listening, they don't. Some aren't listening at all.” The five-day Monsoon Session — the last of the 17th Bihar Assembly — was marked by chaos, uproar, and heated verbal exchanges between members of the ruling NDA and the Opposition parties.

The next Assembly session is expected to be held in November, after a new Assembly is constituted following elections scheduled for October–November.

The Bihar Legislative Council was also adjourned sine die after a brief Monsoon Ses-

sion. Although both Houses saw minimal legislative business during the session, the government succeeded in passing the first supplementary budget for the financial year 2025–26, along with 13 bills—including the Jan Nayak Karpoori Thakur Skill University Bill, 2025 — through voice vote. The proposed university aims to provide a new direction for youth skill development in the state.

On the issue of voter list revision, opposition MLAs once again protested in the Assembly portico. Most opposition members were dressed in black clothes. They blocked the main gate of the Assembly, forcing the opening of an alternative entrance.

SC extends stay on summons to Rahul Gandhi for remarks on Savarkar case

The Supreme Court on Friday extended the interim stay on the summons issued to Congress leader Rahul Gandhi by a Lucknow Magistrate court over his controversial remarks against Vinayak Damodar Savarkar made during the *Bharat Jodo Yatra* undertaken by him in 2022.

A bench comprising Justice Dipankar Datta and Justice Augustine George Masih adjourned the matter for four weeks, allowing the complainant, advocate Nripendra Pandey, to file his reply. Gandhi has also been permitted to file a rejoinder within two weeks thereafter. The Uttar Pradesh government has already submitted its affidavit supporting the trial court's decision, stating that the summoning order was passed after a thorough



re-examination of the case file, witness statements, and the investigation report.

The affidavit claimed that these materials supported the allegations against Gandhi and demonstrated that the Magistrate had “properly applied judicial mind” to the facts and evidence, thus finding a prima facie case under Sections 153A and 505 of the Indian Penal Code (IPC). The State government further alleged that Gandhi's remarks reflected a “deliberate spreading of hatred through pre-planned actions,” and urged the top court to dismiss his appeal. It

defended the Allahabad High Court's earlier refusal to quash the summons as legally sound and justified, asserting that no interference was warranted by the Supreme Court. The summons stemmed from a complaint filed by advocate Nripendra Pandey, who alleged that Gandhi, with an intent to incite social discord, had called Savarkar a “servant of the British” and accused him of accepting a pension from the colonial masters. The remarks were allegedly made during a press interaction in 2022 as part of the *Bharat Jodo Yatra*.

On 25 April 2025, the Supreme Court had stayed the trial court's summons but cautioned Gandhi against making any further derogatory statements about ‘freedom fighter’. The bench had warned that any repeat of such conduct could lead to serious consequences.

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SC extends stay on summons to Rahul Gandhi in remarks on Savarkar case

The remarks were allegedly made during a press interaction in 2022 as part of the *Bharat Jodo Yatra*.

On 25 April 2025, the Supreme Court had stayed the trial court's summons but cautioned Gandhi against making any further derogatory statements about ‘freedom fighter’. The bench had warned that any repeat of such conduct could lead to serious consequences.

Gandhi had approached the top court after the Allahabad High Court, in its April 4 order, refused to quash the summons issued on 12 December 2024, by a Lucknow court. The High Court had remarked that Gandhi had an alternate remedy under Section 397 of the Code of Criminal Procedure (CrPC), which allows a Sessions Court to review the records of lower courts.

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No runners-up in war; CDS calls for 24x7 combat readiness

Future warfare to be led by fighters skilled in technological, informational, and psychological warfare: CDS

Asserting that it was time that defence forces should understand both *Shastra* (warfare) and *Shastra* (knowledge), Chief of Defence Staff General Anil Chauhan said the forces are ready for any action as the Operation Sindoor was still ongoing. Speaking at the Capstone seminar, jointly organised by the Indian Air Force (IAF) and the Centre for Air Power Studies (CAPS), Chauhan said the preparedness level of the armed forces has to be very high, 24x7, 365 days. “As I said earlier, there are no runners up in war, and giving examples of Operation Sindoor, which still continues; our preparedness level has to be very high,” he said. Stating that a warrior today needs to master all three levels of warfare - tactical, operational and



strategic in all domains, the CDS said: “We are seeing an unprecedented pace driven by a relentless march of technology. We now stand at the cusp of what I refer to as the third revolution in military affairs, a term I have coined as convergence kind of warfare. “This form of warfare

merges kinetic and non-kinetic means, combining elements of first- and second-generation warfare with the third. It is a converging tactical, operational, and strategic kind of domain,” he said. Elaborating on the third revolution, the CDS stated that it is defined by the fusion

of tactical, operational, and strategic thinking, alongside an integration of land, sea, air, cyber, space, and cognitive warfare. “Future combat will be dominated by individuals proficient not only in traditional combat roles but also in technological, informational, and psychological

warfare. Modern warriors must become masters of multi-domain operations, functioning simultaneously as tech warriors, info warriors, and scholar warriors,” he added. Speaking about the changing dynamics of the military operations globally, Chauhan said it has raised the importance of info warriors, experts trained to craft and counter narratives, fight misinformation, and influence public perception in what was described as “the invisible battlefield of cognition. “A scholar warrior is a military professional who combines intellectual depth. It combines skills. This individual possesses both strong academic knowledge and practical military expertise, enabling them to analyse complex situations, standardize effectively and adapt to diverse challenges in a dynamic security environment,” Chauhan said.

SC extends stay on summons to Rahul Gandhi in remarks on Savarkar case

The Supreme Court on Friday extended the interim stay on the summons issued to Congress leader Rahul Gandhi by a Lucknow Magistrate court over his controversial remarks against Vinayak Damodar Savarkar made during the *Bharat Jodo Yatra* undertaken by him in 2022. A bench comprising Justice Dipankar Datta and Justice Augustine George Masih adjourned the matter for four weeks, allowing the complainant, advocate Nripendra Pandey, to file his reply. Gandhi has also been permitted to file a rejoinder within two weeks thereafter. The Uttar Pradesh government has already submitted its affidavit supporting the trial court’s decision, stating that the summoning order was passed after a thorough re-examination of the case file, witness statements, and the investigation report. The affidavit claimed that these materials supported the allegations against Gandhi



and demonstrated that the Magistrate had “properly applied judicial mind” to the facts and evidence, thus finding a prima facie case under Sections 153A and 505 of the Indian Penal Code (IPC). The State government further alleged that Gandhi’s remarks reflected a “deliberate spreading of hatred through pre-planned actions,” and urged the top court to dismiss his appeal. It defended the Allahabad High Court’s earlier refusal to quash the summons as legally sound and justified, asserting that no interference was warranted by the Supreme Court. The summons stemmed from a complaint filed by advocate Nripendra Pandey,

who alleged that Gandhi, with an intent to incite social discord, had called Savarkar a “servant of the British” and accused him of accepting a pension from the colonial masters. The remarks were allegedly made during a press interaction in 2022 as part of the *Bharat Jodo Yatra*. On 25 April 2025, the Supreme Court had stayed the trial court’s summons but cautioned Gandhi against making any further derogatory statements about ‘freedom fighter’. The bench had warned that any repeat of such conduct could lead to serious consequences. Gandhi had approached the top court after the Allahabad High Court, in its April 4 order, refused to quash the summons issued on 12 December 2024, by a Lucknow court. The High Court had remarked that Gandhi had an alternate remedy under Section 397 of the Code of Criminal Procedure (CrPC), which allows a Sessions Court to review the records of lower courts.

Ajmer teacher loses ₹12.80 lakh in cyber fraud, accused arrested

JAIPUR, 25 JULY

A woman teacher was duped out of Rs 12.80 lakh by cyber-criminals in Rajasthan’s Ajmer district. The Ajmer Police have arrested one accused in connection with the case from Jaipur. The victim, Gargi Das, an English teacher at the prestigious Mayo College Girls School, received a phone call on 25 August, 2024, from a person claiming to be a Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) officer. The caller threatened to disconnect her mobile number. Shortly afterwards, she received a WhatsApp video call from another individual posing as an officer of the Mumbai Crime Branch.

Sanjay Raut predicts new cabinet for Maha as Sena’s *Saamna* reveals ‘hitlist’

Uddhav Thackeray-led Shiv Sena’s Rajya Sabha MP and chief party spokesperson told media persons here on Friday that Maharashtra is likely to get a “new cabinet” soon, even as Friday’s edition of the Sena-run Marathi daily *Saamna* named eight ministers in the BJP-led Mahayuti government, who may be removed from their posts. “There is a chaotic atmosphere in the state government. Now that the situation has gone out of hand, Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis has reached Delhi and the Maharashtra state government is under the control of Amit Shah. A situation has arisen and big decisions are going to be taken. I have been saying that four ministers will exist

from the cabinet. Now, discussions are underway in Delhi to clean up the cabinet and bring in a new cabinet,” Sanjay Raut said. “For the past few days, the burden of corruption in the government, anti-farmer statements by ministers, scams, details about ministers running ladies’ bars, and bags of money have come to light and Fadnavis is unable to control things,” Sanjay Raut said. The Sena MP said on Thursday, a Jharkhand Police team came to Maharashtra, arrested businessman Amit Salunkhe and took him away with them. Amit Salunkhe is the director of Sumit Facility and the alleged mastermind of the ‘108 ambulance’ scam in the state. “This scam is worth Rs 800 crore. Apart from that, Amit Salunkhe is the financial

backbone of the Shrikant Shinde Medical Foundation (run by Deputy Chief Minister Eknath Shinde’s son Shrikant Shinde). Amit Salunkhe diverted the money from the scam to this foundation. Amit Salunkhe is close to Shrikant Shinde and Eknath Shinde,” Sanjay Raut said. “This arrest is not simple. The government wants to find out where the money went. The threads of this case have reached the Maharashtra state cabinet. It is important that a person close to Shrikant Shinde be arrested and now this case will be sent to the Enforcement Directorate (ED). An investigation will be conducted into how much money was made, how much went to the foundation, how much was used in the elections and how much money went to whom,” Sanjay Raut said.

Bihar CM lashes out at Opposition legislators for ‘irrational behaviour’

Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar lashed out at opposition legislators for their ‘irrational behaviour’ throughout the Monsoon Session of the Bihar Assembly that concluded on Friday without any meaningful discussion. He also criticised the opposition MLAs and MLAs for coming to the House wearing black clothes. Expressing his disappointment, the chief minister said that the opposition had never previously come together wearing black attire. He added: “They have been wearing black clothes continuously throughout this session. This has never hap-



pened before. Earlier, there used to be disruption for just a day or two.” Amid sloganeering of opposition members, the Chief Minister said: “From the Assembly to the Council, they are behaving irrationally. When they should be listening, they don’t. Some aren’t listening at all.”

The five-day Monsoon Session — the last of the 17th Bihar Assembly — was marked by chaos, uproar, and heated verbal exchanges between members of the ruling NDA and the Opposition parties. The next Assembly session is expected to be held in November, after a new Assembly is constituted following elections scheduled for October–November. The Bihar Legislative Council was also adjourned sine die after a brief Monsoon Session. Although both Houses saw minimal legislative business during the session, the government succeeded in passing the first supplementary budget for the financial year 2025–26, along with 13

bills — including the Jan Nayak Karpoori Thakur Skill University Bill, 2025 — through voice vote. The proposed university aims to provide a new direction for youth skill development in the state. On the issue of voter list revision, opposition MLAs once again protested in the Assembly portico. Most opposition members were dressed in black clothes. They blocked the main gate of the Assembly, forcing the opening of an alternative entrance. JD(U) and BJP legislators arrived at the Assembly wearing helmets. They alleged that the opposition parties wanted to establish lawlessness in the House. They came wearing helmets to ensure their safety.

The *padyatra*, covering a distance of 1.5 kilometres, will commence at 7:00 a.m. from the grounds of Himabass Public High School, Drass, and will conclude at the grounds of Government Higher Secondary School,



Bhimbet.

Subsequent to the Padyatra, Union Ministers, accompanied by 100 youth volunteers, will proceed to the Kargil War Memorial to lay wreaths and offer homage to the soldiers who made the supreme sacrifice during the 1999 Kargil conflict. Mukarba underpass work stuck half-way

NEW DELHI: Nearly two years past its original deadline, the project to build an underpass at Mukarba Chowk on Outer Ring Road — meant to ease traffic congestion at one of north Delhi's busiest intersections — is stuck at just 52% completion, after running into financial hurdles, said officials from the public works department (PWD).

Launched in September 2022, the ₹19.5 crore project was initially slated for completion within 12 months, by October 2023. However, a series of setbacks — including land disputes, utility relocations, and now a shortage of funds — has hampered progress.

According to the latest PWD progress report, the land required from the Irrigation and Flood Control (IFC) department has not been paid for. "Payment for the land is yet to be made and the expenditure sanction for land payment of around ₹4.5 crore is awaited. The progress of the construction work is affected due to non-availability of funds," the report stated.

The underpass, connecting Badli to Hauz Khas via Max Walk Road, is being constructed using the box pushing method — a trenchless construction technique that involves hydraulically jacking precast concrete boxes through the soil, minimising disruption to surface traffic. Of the two underpass boxes planned, one has been completed and pushed into position, while work on the second remains stalled. "The second concrete box has been pushed to this section under the Outer Ring Road," an official said.

The underpass is expected to offer significant relief to daily commuters travelling from Badli and adjoining colonies such as SGT Nagar toward Shaheen Bagh, Ashok Nagar, and Anandpur. At present, these vehicles have to use a longer loop via the main Mukarba

Chowk. Once completed, the new route is expected to cut travel distance by at least 1.5 km and help reduce the load on both Outer Ring Road and GT Karnal Road.

"The construction of the underpass on Max Walk Road will greatly benefit residents in this area. Right now, traffic gets badly jammed during peak hours even saving 10-15 minutes will make a big difference to daily commuters like us," said a commuter from SGT Nagar.

Sushil Ahuja, a resident of Badli, said the entire stretch from Mukarba Chowk to Anandpur Metro station remains congested. "No signals work, no traffic police are seen at the spot. Illegal taxi services use the area. It is a pathetic situation. Bypassing this mess will help save an hour of my day. They should expedite the project," he said.

The revised deadline for project completion is December 2025. However, officials admit that even that may be difficult to meet.

"The overall project may still take 12 to 18 months for completion. We are currently awaiting release of funds, and the contractor has also been warned about the slow progress," a senior PWD official said.

The most recent inspection, carried out on June 20, flagged significant delays. "The agency is directed to expedite the box pushing works by deploying additional resources to ensure timely completion of the project without any further delay," the official said.

Even the already-pushed box remains stalled, lacking waterproofing and other critical components. The PWD has

also directed the agency to provide crash barriers and guide walls at the construction site to ensure commuter safety, especially during the ongoing monsoon.

"During the rainy season, the agency has been asked to undertake box pushing with utmost caution to prevent any road settlement. If any settlement occurs, immediate repairs will be required to maintain safe traffic movement," the official added.

The project's location near a major drain managed by the I&FC department had caused a series of delays due to inter-departmental disputes and the relocation of power lines and other underground utilities. These initial reasons have now been compounded by funding constraints, stalling what was meant to be a quick and critical fix for one of Delhi's key traffic choke points.

'GOVT TO VERIFY VILLAGES BEFORE NOTIFYING SOUTH DELHI RIDGE'

NEW DELHI: The Delhi government's department of Roads and Highways has informed the National Green Tribunal (NGT) that it has begun an on-ground verification across 12 villages in the Southern Ridge, which will pave the way for final notification under Section 25 of the Indian Forest Act, 1927.

Sharing detailed timelines, which will see verification of the villages before year-end, the department in its affidavit said that a detailed demarcation was last carried out in 2008.

This comes in compliance with a July 4 NGT directive, which grants complete protection and defines the boundaries. The affidavit, filed by Rakesh Kumar, principal conservator of forests and head of department, outlines that a criminal joint ground verification exercise is underway across 12 villages. This covers a high-level meeting was chaired by the lieutenant governor on May 23 this year, where it was decided that the revenue and forest departments must verify that the areas are free from encroachments before the final notification.

The affidavit includes a detailed timeline for completing the verification village-wise, coordinated by respective district magistrates and sub-divisional magistrates. Surveys of villages in Saket division, namely Sahaypur and Anoli, are expected to be completed between July and August. Surveys of Noh Sural is slated for September, Madhupur for September and October, Subart in November and Bharti will be completed in December and January 2026. In Mehrauli, Dera Mandi was verified in October in August and September, Aja Nagar in October and November, and Jaupur in December and January 2026. Gishmori, Rajpur and Jagahat will be completed by August. The forest department has pledged to finalise notifications after ground verification and has requested NGT to allow six months for the exercise.

ACCUSED VIDEOTAPED ACT | GANG RIVALRY SUSPECTED

9 nabbed for raping, killing 14-yr-old boy

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NEW DELHI: Weeks after the body of a 14-year-old boy bearing multiple wounds and having a cloth tied around his neck was found near Hauz Khas water treatment plant, the Delhi Police on Friday said the minor was allegedly sexually assaulted and stabbed 24 times by a gang who also shot a video of the assault "for fun".

Nine persons — including six minors — have been apprehended for the alleged abduction and murder of a 14-year-old boy whose body was recovered on July 1, Delhi Police said on Friday.

The police said the minor, who lived in the Jeevan Park area, had injuries indicating he was sexually assaulted and stabbed multiple times. Investigators alleged that the gang suspected the boy of sharing information with a rival gang and abducted him to retaliate.

The police, on July 1, recovered the body from near the Meera Canal.

"He was found near the canal, unattended and bearing multiple stab wounds. Initial probe suggested he may have been targeted due to links with local party criminals," said deputy commissioner of police (eastern north) Harshvardh Swami.

Suspects were apprehended on July 3 from nearby areas.

During questioning, police said the accused revealed they had confronted the boy, taken him to a secluded spot near the canal, and attacked him.

"The group believed the boy was passing information to a rival gang. He was forcibly

taken from a public place in the presence of his friends. Then, they sexually assaulted him, killed him and abandoned his body in the water," said Swami. The three remaining accused were traced to a Kamaua Yatra camp in Meerut and apprehended on July 16. "We tracked them via their social media activity. Given the large crowds, we approached them disguised as fellow pilgrims. Once they reached Meerut, we moved in to apprehend them," said a police investigator.

Police said they have recovered mobile phones allegedly containing videos of the sexual assault. "The footage confirms the boy was subjected to degrading treatment and extreme violence," an investigator said, adding that three laptops were likely used in the assault.

The minor's autopsy report confirmed he had been sexually assaulted and stabbed at least 24 times.

The boy is survived by his mother and siblings, who work in local shops and factories.

Court orders FIR in 2020 Delhi riots case

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NEW DELHI: A Delhi court has ordered the registration of a criminal case in the 2020 Delhi riots case, observing that police failed to act on the complaint given by the victim's family. The court, which was hearing a writ petition filed by the victim's family, directed the police to register a case and investigate the matter.

The order was passed by judicial magistrate first class, Isha Zaidi, who was presiding over an application moved by Hisham Ahmed, who claimed that his family was subjected to a targeted attack by more than half a dozen men, seven of whom he could identify. Ahmed claimed that the accused were armed with weapons and used criminal violence against them and threatened to kill them.

He claimed that the accused vandalised his house and robbed valuable items. He claimed that he approached the Karawal Nagar Police Station with a complaint on May 1, seeking registration of an FIR. However, his case was closed without any further investigation.

The court said, "The complaint is a genuine one and the police has made serious allegations... Sixth allegations cannot be deleted or ignored merely by shifting with a general FIR."

STALKER KILLS MAN OVER FRIENDSHIP WITH WOMAN
